## Director Young:

In accordance with the *Government Charge Card Abuse Prevention Act of* 2012, <sup>1</sup> I am providing my annual report on the progress of implementation of any charge card related audit recommendations issued by my office. Regarding our oversight of the Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council's (Council) government charge card program, my office has not issued any charge card related audit findings and recommendations.

As reported in last year's letter, in Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, my office completed a risk assessment of the Council's charge card and convenience check program for FY 2021 and FY 2022. In our January 2024 memorandum, *Risk Assessment of the Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council's Charge Card and Convenience Check Program* (OIG-CA-24-010; January 30, 2024), we reported the overall risk of illegal, improper, or erroneous purchases and payments in the Council's charge card program as moderate, and the Council's convenience check program as very low. As such, no audits of the Council's charge card and convenience check program are planned at this time; however, we did inform the Council's management of risk areas identified during our most recent assessment.
